**Duane C. Spooner, 68**, Tappen, ND passed away Monday, October 19, 2020 at Essentia Health, Fargo. Memorial Service: 2:00 P.M. Saturday, October 24, 2020 at St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church, Tappen, ND with visitation starting at 1:00 P.M. On October 19, 2020, Duane Curtis Spooner left his terrestrial binds for the great ethereal hunting plains.

Duane was born April, 19, 1952 in Crosby, ND as the third of six children. His parents Alan and Ethel (Nygaard) Spooner were farmers in Noonan, ND and worked hard to provide for and instill the hard work ethic, integrities, and values that Duane used to carry himself through life. A Devotion: Revelation 14:13, "Duane Is Truly Blessed!"

"And I heard a voice from heaven say, "Write: Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on." "Yes," says the Spirit, "because

**they will rest from their labor.**" <sup>(The Word of the LORD)</sup> In the name of Jesus Christ, who was crucified, died, and rose on Easter to give Duane and you victory over sin and death.

We see clearly tonight the wages of sin is death. Our LORD took Duane suddenly. One night Duane is in his home, the next night he is taken home to heaven. But don't be mad at God for something Satan and Adam and Eve caused. Tonight, we are also reminded that the cold finger of death can take any of us at any time.

David knew this. He was anointed to be the next king of Israel. But Saul as king still had all power. David told his beloved friend and Saul's son Jonathan, "Yet as surely as the LORD lives and as you live, there is only a step between me and death." <sup>(1 Sam 20:3)</sup>

Duane could say when fell at home, and the ambulance took him to the hospital, "*There was one step between me and eternal life*."

Why does God allow such tragedy? To punish us? Nope! To warn us! Jesus said, "Those eighteen who died when the tower in Siloam fell on them-- do you think they were more guilty than all the others living in Jerusalem? <sup>5</sup> I tell you, no! But unless you repent, you too will all perish." <sup>(Lk 13:4-5)</sup> We Christians live a life of repentant faith, confessing our sin to God, trusting Jesus has taken away our sin. Every moment of life is a precious gift. Treasure it!

Today we are also sad. Sad, since we are saying so long to Duane. Sad, he won't see his grandchildren grow up. We are sad for Kristie for losing her husband of 41 years. We are sad for Josh, Andrea, and Eric for losing their Dad, and Josh's business partner.

But as Christians, tonight we rejoice! Duane is a baptized child of God, with God's promise of eternal life. When Martha's brother Lazarus died, Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies, and whoever lives and believes in me will never perish." <sup>(Jn 11:25)</sup> Then to prove his power over death, Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead. Jesus defeated death on Easter. Now when a Christian believer dies, we know God takes their soul to heaven. Jesus told the believing criminal on the cross, "Today you will be with me in paradise." <sup>(Lk 23:43)</sup> Knowing this truth Paul desired, "to depart and be with Christ, which is better by far." <sup>(Phil 1:23)</sup> So when a believer dies we are happy for them. We rejoice! Our funeral text helps us rejoice. It is from Revelation. Jesus gave the Apostle John a series of visions to reveal to his people the future of the NT age. Because of sin and Satan is constantly attacking us, the church, Revelation is a commentary on some NT verses. Acts 14:22 says, "We **must go through many hardships to enter the kingdom of God.**" We all know hardship, especially with Covid and death. Christ also warns us with a promise. "Because of the increase of wickedness, the love of many will grow cold. But whoever endures to the end will be saved." (Mat 24:12) Revelation also echoes Christ's Word, "I have told you these things, so that in me you have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." (Jn 16:33) Revelation comforts and strengthens us Christian in our struggles these last days. Now it seems, as evil is winning. But Revelation tells us, "In the end, Christ wins!" When Christ wins, we win, and Duane has won

In Revelation 14, the Apostle John is taken up to heaven to receive another of 7 visions to comfort God's believers. John heard the voice of the exulted Christ. "And I heard a voice from heaven say, "Write: Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on." This is directly from God himself. Not a trick or a lie, but the truth from Christ, "Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on." When a Christian believer dies with faith in Jesus as their Savior, they are truly blessed. Jesus says, "Blessed are those who hear the word of God and keep it." (Lk 11:28) Spiritual blessings come to us by keeping God's Word. Yes, we have eternal blessings!

Yes, "Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on." On Monday evening, despite Duane fighting to stay alive with his family, his race was over. Jesus said to Duane, "Today you will be with me in paradise." <sup>(Lk 23:43)</sup> Monday, the believing soul of Duane went home to heaven to be with Jesus. Not because Duane earned or deserves heaven. Duane would be the first to tell he doesn't. Duane is in heaven because he trusted Jesus as his Savior who earned heaven for him. Christ died for Duane and opened heaven by his resurrection. Duane also received the Lord's Supper the first Sunday this month. He was assured again that his sin was forgiven by Christ.
